Additional Costs to Consider

Tag Price: The price of each tag is not included in the cost of a hunt. The following list is an average price for each tag as of 2024.

Elk/Deer Combo Tag \$1300

Bear Tag: \$350

Merriam Turkey: \$116

Mountain Lion: \$350

Wolf: \$50

Preference/Bonus Points: For each elk/deer combo tag there are 2 preference points that will need to be purchased to have a better chance of drawing a tag. Each preference point costs \$100. Bonus points can also be purchased for lottery draws for mountain lion, goat, sheep, moose, etc for \$100

Airport Pickup/Delivery- If you choose to fly into Spokane Airport we have drivers available to pick you up and drop you off on Sundays at a designated time for \$100. See "Travel Information" for additional information on traveling

Shipping Gear/Meat: If you would like to ship your gear to us (most people opt in to ship their gear in coolers) we are able to receive the gear one week prior to your hunt and we will ship your gear back to you within a week after leaving. To ship frozen meat to your home can cost between \$1000-\$2000 depending on available options, coolers, weight and travel. If you want us to handle this for you, we will give you an estimate for the plan that works best for you before you leave.

Meat Processing: There are various options to meat processing available. We will bring all animals out of the wood quartered and deboned. We will freeze the meat in cloth meat bags and put them in your coolers for travel for free

We offer meat processing for \$3 per pound and will send you home with everything cut, ground, vacuum sealed, labeled and frozen.

If you do not bring your own cooler, we try to keep coolers in stock for \$60 per cooler

Tips: Your guide will be working day in and day out months in advance to prepare for your hunt. Although they are compensated for their expertise a tip is a polite way to thank them for their efforts in making your hunt the best it could be. The average tip for your guide is 15-20% of your hunt.

The apprentices are working for free towards their guide license in the future. They are here to assist the guide in making your hunt a great experience. They will be scouting, moving vehicles, doing airport runs, packing out your animals, etc. The average tip for each apprentice/packer is \$100-\$200 for their assistance on your hunt.

The housekeeper/cook will be the first one awake in the morning and last one to sleep at night to ensure that everything is kept as comfortable as possible. They prepare a hot breakfast every morning, send you with a packed lunch for the afternoon, and will have a homemade dinner prepared for any time of the night your hunt is over. They're responsible for keeping your room clean and bathrooms stocked with essentials as well as doing laundry upon your request. The average tip for the housekeeper/cook is \$100-\$200
